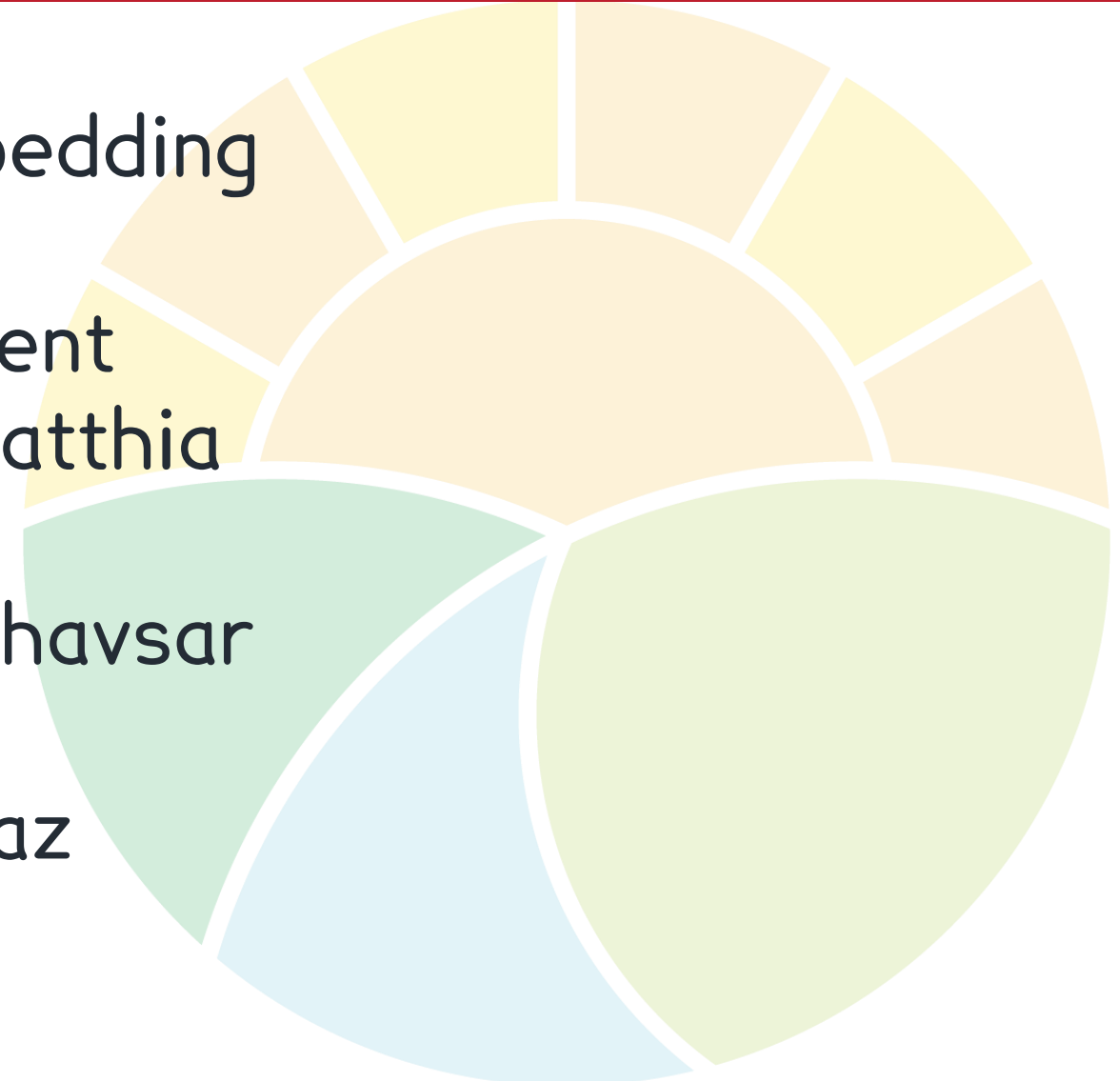

Routines and Expectations

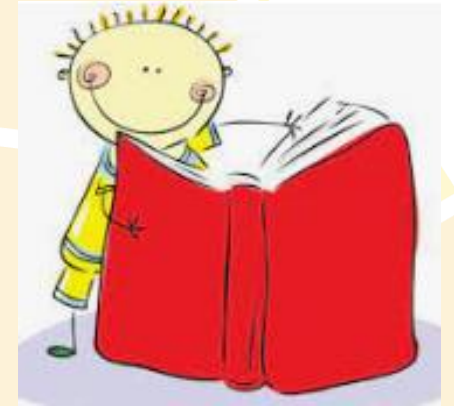


- School day is 8:45am – 3:20pm

Curriculum Map

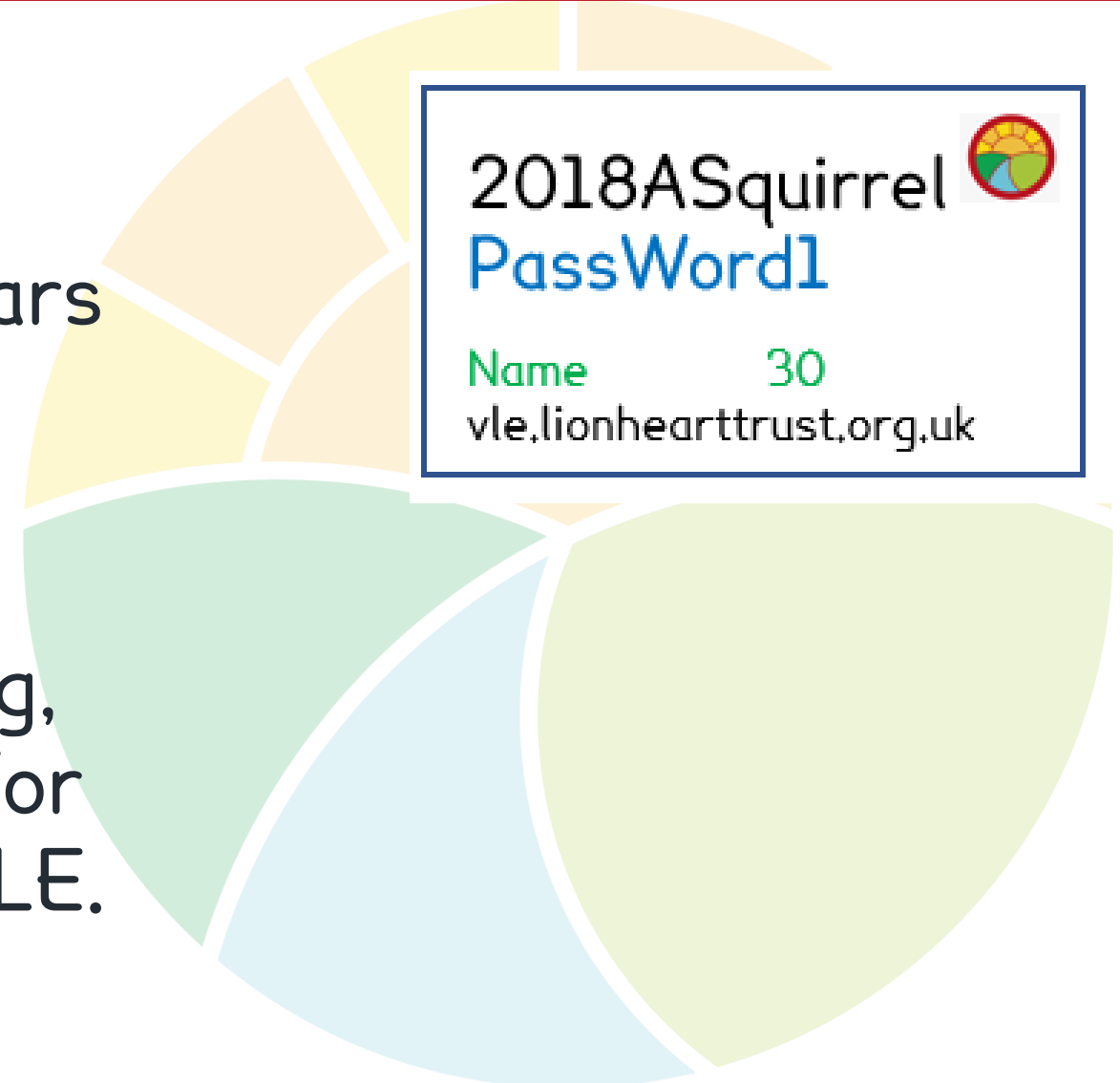

In this course, you can access the learning in the core subjects - Reading, Writing, Spelling, mathematics - that Squirrels pupils have been doing in school during the Autumn Term 2023.

The learning in core subjects is organised in folders in week order.

There are PowerPoints of the learning material covered by pupils together with a range of activities, including support activities and challenge 'digging deeper' activities.

The weekly spellings are in the spelling folder, where the Spelling PowerPoint document includes a range of spelling activities linked to the target words. If your child works on the Nessy programme, it is advisable that your child focuses on these spellings. However, all children can use the spelling PowerPoint to learn the meaning of the year 5 spelling words.

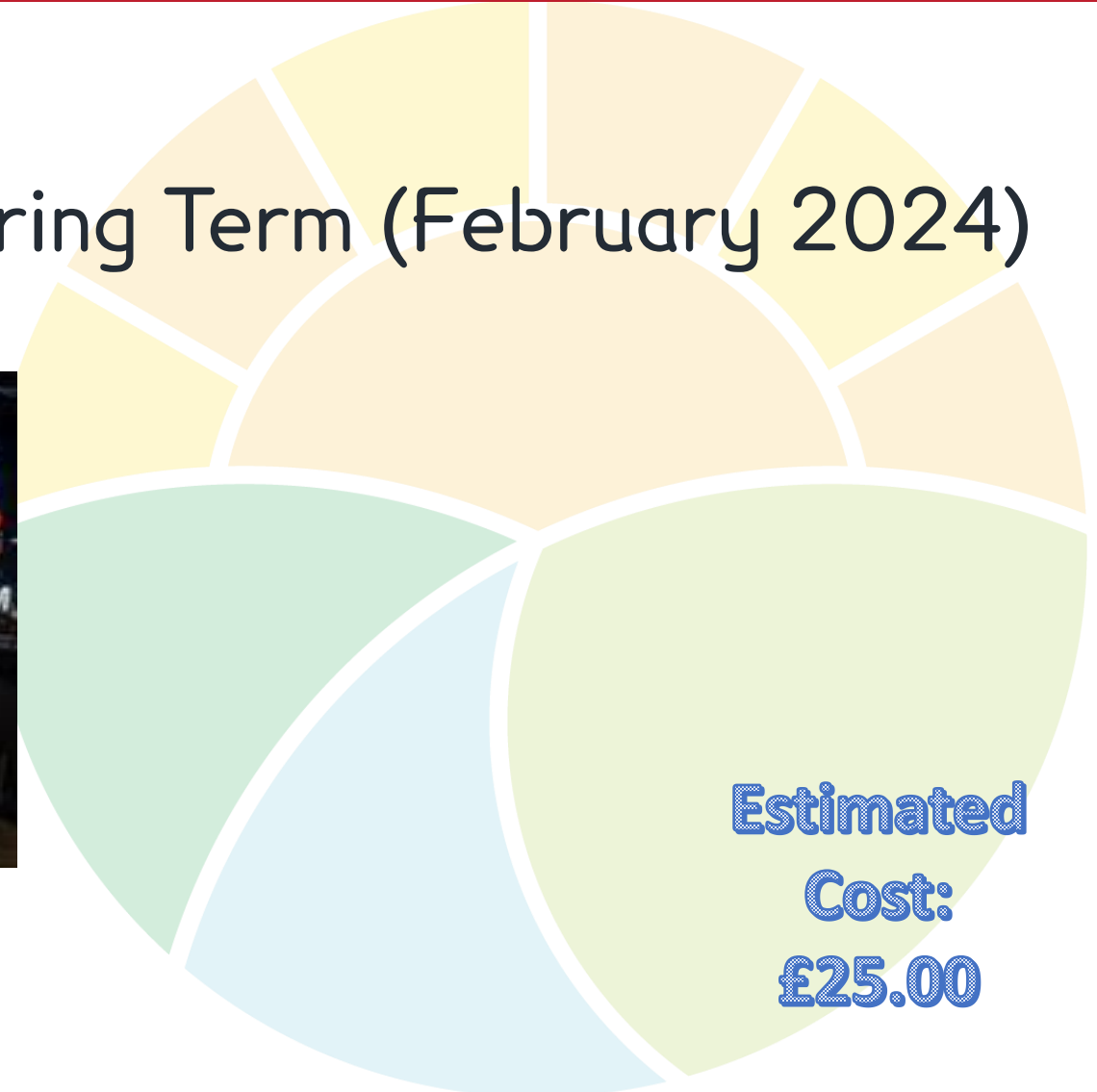
Multiplication facts and their associated division facts remain very important in year 5 as they underpin lots of the work we do in the areas of number and calculations. We encourage your child to keep practising these at home: TimesTablesRockStars is an engaging way for your child to do this.

There is a folder called Foundation Subjects. In this folder, there is the key vocabulary and sticky knowledge for each of these subjects. Learning this key knowledge is vital. Your child will be familiar with the 'traffic light' system of learning these facts that we use in school activities. There are a range of games you could play, such as 'Memory' or 'Snap' where you match the key word to its meaning.

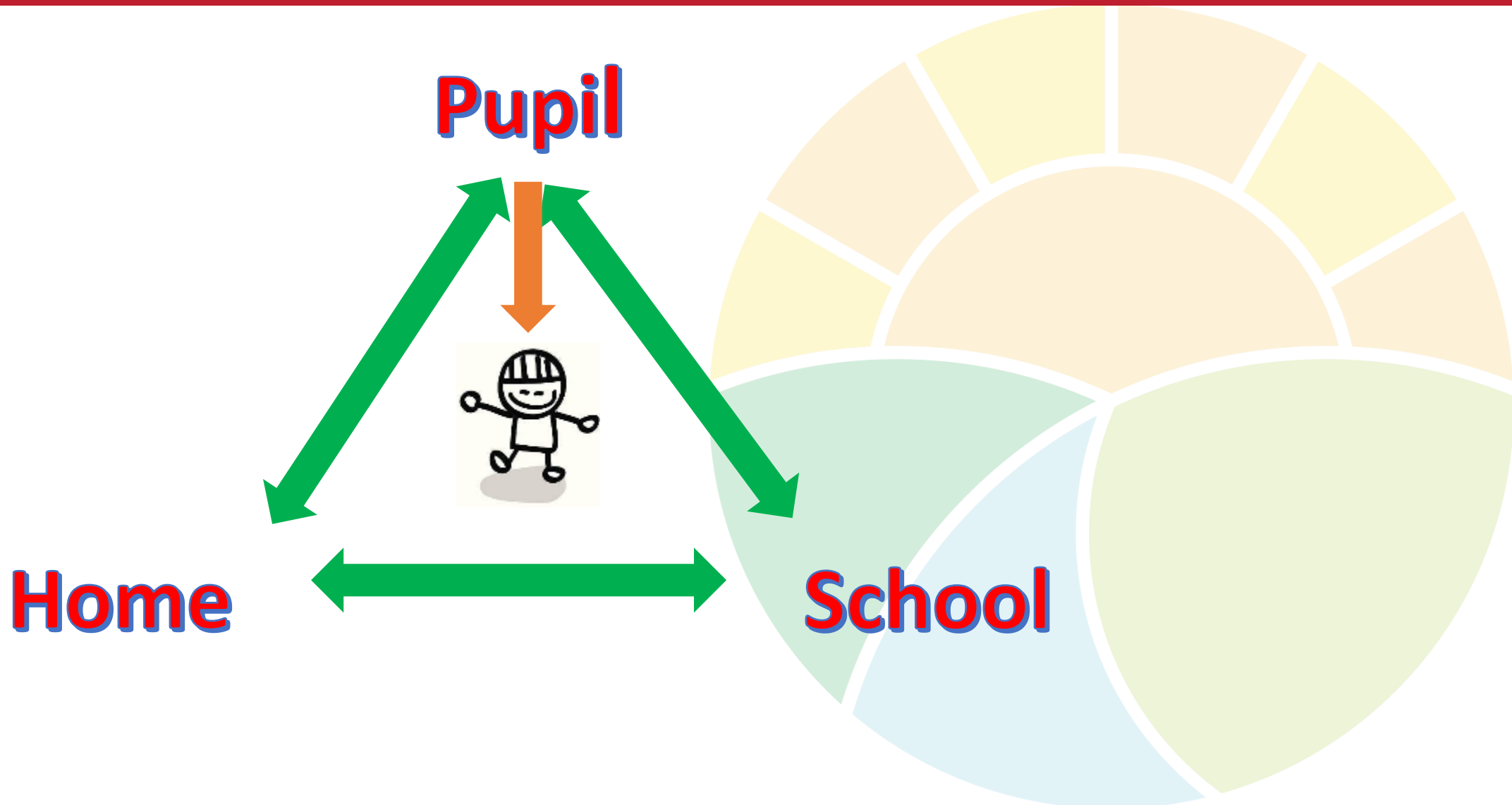
